Dear Chair Hyde-Smith and Ranking Member Schatz:

The purpose of this letter is to request a technical correction to a Fiscal Year 2024 Congressionally Directed Spending project in the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies bill, listed below. I certify that neither I nor my immediate family has a pecuniary interest in any of the Congressionally Directed Spending items that I have requested, consistent with the requirements of paragraph 9 of Rule XLIV of the Standing Rules of the Senate. I certify that the entities for which I have requested Congressionally Directed Spending are not for-profit entities.

The reason for this necessary correction is that the site originally selected for the Hardwoods Permanent Supportive Housing project requires a new roof that makes the location cited in the project name financially unviable in its current state. A correction is needed to allow the recipient to select a new site for this project, a change that remains within the scope of the original project purpose.
