3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "School Lunch Debt

5 Cancellation Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. CANCELLATION OF SCHOOL MEAL DEBT.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the8 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture

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shall cancel and eliminate all debts owed by households 1 2 as of the date of enactment of this Act for school meals under-3 4 (1) the school lunch program established under 5 the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act 6 (42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.), including through commu-7 nity eligibility under section 11(a)(1)(F) of that Act 8 (42 U.S.C. 1759a(a)(1)(F)); and 9 (2) the school breakfast program under section 10 4 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 11 1773). 12 (b) PAYMENT OF CANCELLED DEBT.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall— 13 14 (1) use the funds of the Commodity Credit Cor-15 poration to pay the amount of debt cancelled under 16 subsection (a) to each local educational authority to 17 which the debt is owed by the applicable households; 18 and 19 (2) provide confirmation of the cancelled debt 20 to each applicable household. 21 (c) CANCELLATION AUTHORITY.—Section 7 of the

22 Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C.
23 1756) is amended by adding at the end the following:

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"(e) School Meal Debt Cancellation Author-

2 ITY.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 3 Secretary— 4 "(1) may cancel and eliminate all debts owed by 5 households for school meals under the school lunch 6 program under this Act and the school breakfast 7 program under section 4 of the Child Nutrition Act 8 of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1773); and 9 ((2) shall)10 "(A) use the funds of the Commodity 11 Credit Corporation to pay the amount of debt 12 cancelled under paragraph (1) to each local 13 educational authority to which the debt is owed 14 by the applicable households; and 15 "(B) provide confirmation of the cancelled 16 debt to each applicable household.". 17 SEC. 3. USE OF COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION FUNDS 18 FOR OTHER NUTRITION PROGRAMS. 19 (a) Commodity Supplemental Food Program.— 20 Section 4(a) of the Agriculture and Consumer Protection 21 Act of 1973 (7 U.S.C. 612c note; Public Law 93-86) is 22 amended, in the first sentence— (1) by striking "2023" and inserting "2030"; 23 24 and

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(2) by inserting "and funds of the Commodity 1 2 Credit Corporation" after "Treasury". 3 (b) Emergency Food Assistance Program.— 4 Section 204 of the Emergency Food Assistance Act of 5 1983 (7 U.S.C. 7508) is amended— 6 (1) in subsection (b), by striking "the funds" and all that follows through "the States" and insert-7 ing "any funds of the Commodity Credit Corpora-8 9 tion used to carry out this Act"; and 10 (2) by adding at the end the following: 11 "(c) Commodity Credit Corporation Funds.—In 12 addition to any other funds made available, of the funds 13 of the Commodity Credit Corporation, the Secretary may use such sums as are necessary to carry out this Act.". 14
